Studying Science at the University of Melbourne

Maybe you've always known that you wanted to be a marine biologist. Or perhaps you're still deciding whether you want to be an engineer or a geologist. A doctor or a vet? A data scientist or a physicist? A chemist or a psychologist?

The <u>Bachelor of Science</u> is a pathway to all these careers, and hundreds more. With more than 40 majors on offer, students can select from the full range of *science*, *biomedicine*, *mathematics*, *engineering*, and *IT subjects*. The federal government is expanding funding to places for Australian students to hoping to study *physics*, *mathematics*, or *chemistry*.

The Bachelor of Science is a **3-year degree**, in which students complete **24 subjects**. Of the 24 subjects, some will contribute to their **major** (chosen specialisation), some will be **science electives** (other science subjects), and some will be **breadth** (non-science) subjects.

<u>NOTE</u>: As part of the Bachelor of Science, domestic students can participate in the **Strategic Sciences Program (SSP)**. It is designed to provide ambitious students with the technical skills and knowledge needed to work in a diverse range of STEM careers, particularly those critical to national security.

As part of the program, students will interact with leading academics and industry experts and have opportunities to expand their network. Students will have the option of a major in either Physics, Chemistry, or Mathematics and Statistics, plus access to specialised subjects. As Australia and the world face a growing skills gap in STEM-related industries, this program will prepare students to work in highly skilled, critical roles.

In their third year, students can participate in an internship subject to build workforce knowledge and professional networks aligned to their studies and area of interest.

Global Educators Diploma of Nursing Pathway

Gain the essential skills and knowledge to work as an enrolled nurse in a variety of healthcare settings with our Diploma of Nursing course.

Students learn how to implement general nursing care, assess client's health and analyse health-related information. They also learn how to administer and monitor medications and attend to the needs of a range of healthcare clients, including older clients, acute care clients and people with mental health conditions. The course assists students in developing effective communication skills and understanding how to work within the legal and ethical parameters in nursing.

Students complete a minimum of 400 hours of mandatory clinical placement in a range of healthcare settings across metropolitan, regional and rural areas.

After successful completion of the *Diploma of Nursing* — which is currently a FREE TAFE course — students may have the option of applying to universities and being granted up to 12 months credit towards most 3-year Bachelor of Nursing qualifications. Box Hill Institute has specific articulation arrangements with *ACU* and *Deakin University*.

Successful recipients will receive \$15,000 over three years to help support their undergraduate studies in technology, and will also have access to paid internships and inspiring mentors. In addition, students may receive a further \$5,000 to cover the cost of attending the Disruptive Leaders Program. Best of all, students will become a lifelong member of the Westpac 100 Scholars Network: an inclusive group of some of the brightest young minds in Australia. Lifelong membership to this network gives students access to one of Australia's most diverse meetings of like minds. It is designed to be inspiring, influential and a life-long learning experience. Psychology Degrees in Victoria in 2025

Psychology is a popular field of study in Australia and is taught at universities in every state and territory. With diverse workplace settings and areas of expertise, psychology can be a highly rewarding and satisfying career choice. Psychologists who complete postgraduate studies in specific areas of psychology may be eligible to receive area of practice endorsement from the Psychology Board of Australia. Students are reminded that, for the most part, the only VCE prerequisite subject for university entry is an English. Students should verify this at <u>VTAC</u>. Please note that after completion of an APAC accredited undergraduate degree, a further minimum of three years education and training in psychology is required to register as a psychologist in Australia.

Speech Pathology and Audiology Degrees in Victoria in 2025

Speech Pathologists study, diagnose and treat communication and swallowing disorders, including difficulties with speech, language, fluency and voice. Four Victorian universities offer an undergraduate degree in Speech Pathology, and these courses on offer are listed below. A number of these universities also offer graduate courses in speech pathology.

Audiologists are health care professionals who identify, assess and manage disorders of hearing, balance and other neural systems.

<u>Note</u>: From 2026, Monash University will be offering the <u>Bachelor of Speech Pathology (Honours)</u> at the Peninsula Campus.

<u>Note</u>: The University of Melbourne offers a <u>Master of Speech Pathology</u> and the entry requirement for this course is the successful completion of an undergraduate degree in a relevant discipline (Science, Biomedicine, Linguistics, Phonetics, Education, Psychology).

From 2025, Deakin University is also offering a <u>Master of Speech Pathology</u> and the entry requirements are successful completion of any bachelor's degree in a relevant discipline (linguistics, biomedicine, health sciences, nursing, midwifery, neuroscience, public health, psychology, education, allied health), plus a unit in human anatomy and physiology.

The University of Melbourne also offers a <u>Master of Clinical Audiology</u>, and the entry requirement is an undergraduate degree in a relevant discipline (Science, Heath Sciences, Biomedicine, Linguistics, Phonetics, Psychology, Music), or equivalent.

With exposure to masterclasses covering the finer and more specialised areas of hotel service, students will be equipped for a career offering exceptional service in the international hotel industry.
