CAREERS WORK EXPERIENCE

2026 Opportunities for Year 10, 11 and 12



Students may undertake a maximum of 30 days work experience per year. Placements are subject to availability, with each application considered carefully; however, only some applications are successful. Many quality work experience providers are fully booked out early in the year so those students leaving requests until close to the application due date may miss out due to lack of available places. Students that source their own work experience placement are more likely to proceed. The Secondary School Office may assist students that are unsuccessful sourcing their own placement.

Not all employers provide work experience opportunities and are not required to do so. Similarly, some employers offer very limited work experience and/ or expressions of interest are called for once per year. The following work experience dates outline when applications must be submitted by, as well as the dates available for placement. Please adhere to these dates to avoid disappointment.

2026 Work Experience Dates

Term 1

- 7 April – 17 April 2026 (school holidays) - **Year 10, 11 and 12**

Applications for this term are due on or before 3.50pm on **Friday 13 March 2026**

Term 2

- 22 June – 26 June 2026 (last week of Term 2) - **Year 10 only**

NOTE: Work experience in the last week of term cannot be conducted on neighbouring properties.

- 29 June – 13 July 2026 (school holidays) - **Year 10, 11 and 12**

Applications for this term are due on or before 3.50pm on **Friday 29 May 2026**

Term 3

- 14 September – 5 October 2026 (school holidays) - **Year 10, 11 and 12**

NOTE: 100EP takes precedence over work experience.

Applications for this term are due on or before 3.50pm on **Friday 21 August 2026**

Term 4

- 16 November – 24 November 2026 - **Year 10, 11 and 12**

NOTE: By application only by those with local SAT opportunity and in consultation with Head of Year and Head of VET. Students must attend Secondary School Speech Day on Wednesday 25 November.

- 27 November – 4 December 2026 (school holidays) - **Year 10, 11 only**

Applications for this term are due on or before 3.50pm on **Friday 16 October 2026**

NOTE: This period covers the mandated WorkCover Insurance requirements for all schools; hence why all Work Experience placements must be pre-approved and documented by the School.

Work experience application forms are now electronic and available via the **Student Cafe and Parent Lounge**.

Applications are to be submitted to the SSO in person or via email workexperience@rgs.qld.edu.au. All work experience must be approved and organised a minimum of 3 weeks prior to starting.

The [Deadly Start Program](#) is more than a qualification, it's a culturally safe, school-based career pathway into the healthcare sector for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. If you have students who have completed an EOI they will need to complete this application.

Here's how it works:

Lay The Foundations (Semester 1, 2026)

Year 11 students complete the HLT23221 Certificate II in Health Support Services, laying the foundation with skills in communication, infection control, and workplace safety— all while studying for their QCE.

Earn while you Learn! (July 2025 – June 2026)

Eligible students transition into a paid school-based traineeship with Queensland Health, working 1 day per week at a local health facility while training toward their Certificate III in Health Services Assistance.

Throughout the 18-month program, students receive ongoing cultural mentorship and support, and are employed in real hospital settings across one of 16 Queensland Health and Hospital Services (HHSs), from Torres Strait Islands to the Gold Coast and everywhere in between.

CAREERS APPRENTICESHIPS



Start your career journey with a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship

School-based apprenticeships and traineeships (SATs) enable you to work and train towards a recognised qualification, while you complete your Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) or equivalent.

How does the SAT journey begin?

Before you can get started, there are four key stakeholders involved in your school-based apprenticeship or traineeship: your school, your employer, the Queensland government (DTET) and your supervising registered training organisation.

1. **School:** You'll need to gain approval from the school. We will work with your employer and registered training organisation to create your training schedule. In order to fit your SAT around your school studies, some of your paid employment and/or training will become part of your school timetable.
2. **Employer:** Once you've chosen your course, you will need to find an employer you can complete your apprenticeship or traineeship through. An employer can be found through your family or friends, by contacting businesses directly, using internet job search engines such as [Seek](#).
3. **Queensland Government:** They oversee the funding and compliance of your SAT.
4. Your Supervising Registered Training Organisation will help provide you with the knowledge, skills and training to drive you towards your career destination.

JOB SPOTLIGHT

How to become a Marine Technician

Complete a trade qualification in mechanical fitting, engineering, electrical work, or refrigeration and air conditioning through an apprenticeship. This gives you the foundational technical skills needed for marine work. Gain general technical experience in your trade area, then complete additional training in marine-specific systems, diesel engines, or marine electronics through short courses or vocational qualifications in marine engineering technology.

Obtain maritime certifications and safety training relevant to the vessel types and regions where you want to work. Requirements vary depending on vessel size and operation type.

Start with entry-level positions on smaller vessels or in port-based maintenance roles, building your experience with different marine systems before moving to larger vessels or more specialised technical positions.

What skills do I need as a Marine Technician?

- Strong mechanical aptitude, Excellent problem-solver
- Attention to detail, Adaptable and resourceful
- Good communicator, Physically capable
- Self-motivated, independent, Calm under pressure



What can I do right now?

If you're in high school and interested in working as a Marine Technician, here are some practical steps:

- Pursue a trade apprenticeship in mechanical fitting, electrical work, or refrigeration to build core technical skills
- Look for casual work or volunteer opportunities at marinas, boat clubs, or with marine maintenance companies to gain exposure to the industry
- Talk to Marine Technicians, yacht crew, or marina managers about their work and the pathways into marine technical roles

What age can a child start work in QLD?

In Queensland, the minimum age for employment is 13 years. However, children aged 11 to 12 can work under specific conditions, such as delivering newspapers or advertising materials, but not between 6 PM and 6 AM.



CAREERS ACTIVE VOLUNTEERING

CHC14015 Certificate I in Active Volunteering

In Year 10, all RGS students are required to undertake CHC14015 Certificate I in Active Volunteering. The total cost of this course is \$200 including the \$60 for HLTAID010 Provide basic emergency life support, which is a unit of competency within the certificate. The cost of CHC14015 Certificate I in Active Volunteering will be added to students' school fee accounts in 2026.

Active volunteering is crucial for students


